On January 10, 1916 at a public meeting held in the Old Museum building at Bowen Hills, attended by the Governor, the Premier and other government, civic and military leaders, a resolution was carried to establish the ANZAC Day Commemoration Committee. The Committee was charged with paying homage to the Gallipoli fallen and support to the survivors. It was decided that the first commemorations would take place on April 25, 1916 one year after the Gallipoli landings and so was born the ANZAC Day tradition. The first Brisbane Dawn service was held at the newly dedicated Shrine of Remembrance on April 25, 1931.

On this day, we commemorate the service and sacrifice of all Australians and New Zealanders who have served— and we honour those who are currently serving.
